<u>Clinical Excellence – Psychosocial</u> Marlene Baumel, Nurse, Prévost/Dorval Campuses, DPS

As Prévost campus was picked to pilot the Substance Abuse Service Path and Access Mechanism and the 2nd level Mental Health table, Marlene has taken a leading role in screening and evaluating high risk clients as well as leading inter-disciplinary discussions. While working on these projects, Marlene always made sure to offer and maintain high quality services. She inspires everyone around her with her dedication, caring and respect of clients independent of the differences in their histories, language, and cultural backgrounds. She is extremely skilled in establishing therapeutic relationships with clients. Her availability and her professionalism are greatly appreciated by colleagues and external partners. He is always the first to volunteer to visit a client on his day off or organize a work crew to clean up the outside property of the group home. Rodney conducts himself as a role model to the clients of Bourbonnière Group Home, and as a man of deep faith, he understands the importance of inner strength as the foundation to face life's many challenges.
