continued counsel

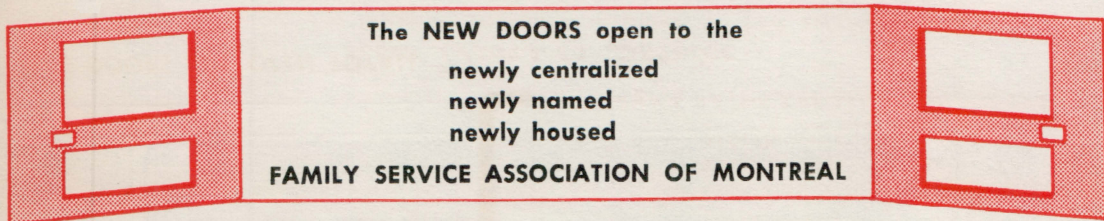
Of the **1921** served —

Homemaker Service on 171
occasions
741 were *single and elderly* people
who were given special case-

elderly —

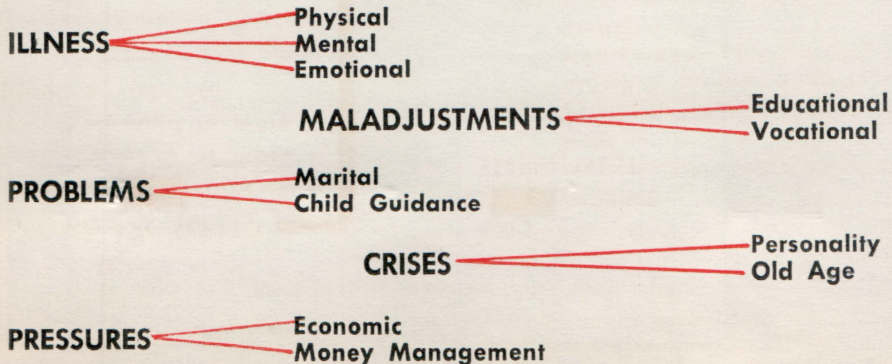
THE SERVICE PATHS ARE MANY AND DIVERSE
